

RULES FOR CHRYSANTHEMUM SHOW PARTICIPATION

1. The show is open to all persons from India and abroad.
2. Each Exhibitor will fill in the enclosed Entry Form and send it along with appropriate **entry fee of Rs. 10/-** per exhibit so as to reach the undermentioned, not later than 5p.m., on 13th December, 2024.

The entry fee must be remitted in cash only. Cheques cannot be accepted. Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Society at double the entry fee, by 10 a.m., on 14th December. Exhibitors are requested to send their entries at an early date to avoid last minute rush.

- 2 a. The Show will be held on 14th & 15th December 2024, at **Helipad Ground/ Shivalik Park, near Shiphaat, Sector - 33A, Noida**. It will be open to Public from 1 p.m. on 14th December and 9 a.m. on 15th December,
3. Exhibits in pots must be staged between 6 a.m. - 10 a.m. 14th December. Judging of the potted exhibits will start on Saturday, by 11 a.m. sharp . No exhibit will be permitted to be staged when the judging has started. No extension of time shall be allowed under any circumstances. During the judging no exhibitor, mali or visitor will be allowed to remain in the exhibition enclosures.
4. The Exhibits in pots shall be returned to the exhibitors after 6 p.m. on Sunday and these cannot be removed earlier under any circumstances.
5. All possible care of the exhibits will be taken but the Society cannot take responsibility for any loss or damage.
6. An exhibitor may enter up to three exhibits in each section. separate fee shall be charged for each exhibit entered, but an exhibitor can be awarded only one prize in a section. All members of a house shall be treated as one exhibitor and entries from one house shall be entered in one name.

7. Every exhibitor will be allotted an entry number. Each exhibit must be accompanied by an exhibit card provided by the Society, and bear the entry number. The card shall be placed in front of the exhibit. No alteration or addition to the exhibit card shall be made. The name of exhibitors and their number shall be not appear on the exhibits. Exhibits by nursurymen or professionals must not bear any placards or price tags.
8. It will be necessary for exhibitors to name the large- flowering varieties exhibited by them as for as practicable.
9. In the case of institutions, nurseries etc. Where the entry is not by an individual in her/ his own capacity, the exhibit shall be from plants growing in the gardens of the aforesaid bodies for at least three months and shall not have been obtained by gift, purchase, by exchange or in any other way from others, individuals or corporate bodies. pooling of exhibits or joint entries by more than one institution, nursery etc. is NOT permitted.
10. The dimensions of the pots used should not exeed 12 inches in overall height and inner diameter except where stated otherwise. An exhibitor is at liberty to grow Chrysanthemum flowers in smaller pots as well. Pots of thick plastic up to 12" diameter are also allowed. All exhibits in pots showing signs of having been lifted from the ground within the last three months prior to the Show shall be disqualified.
11. Exhibitors shall, if required, permit such persons as may be appointed by the Society to view their nurseries/ gardens, prior to or after the Show.
12. In each section there will be one first prize, one second prize and one third prize. The judges may withhold any prize when, in their opinion, the wxhibits do not merit the prize. They may also award an extra first, second, or third prize in any section in which the quality of an exhibit, in their opinion, warrants for doing so.
13. For the award of Challenge Trophies each first prize will carry 3 points, second prize 2 point and third prize1 point of credit.

14. Pots plants will be judged on the basis of the overall quality of the blooms and also the health of plants.
15. In the event of an objection to the decision of the judges an appeal can be made to the Chrysanthemum Show committee on depositing Rs. 50/- for every objection with the Secretary within half an hour after the judging is over. There upon the Chrysanthemum Show Committee, at its discretion, may request the judges to reconsider their decision. Subject to this, the decision of the judges shall be final. The deposit is not refundable.

Exhibitors should note that it is not possible to extend the half - hour period of time for lodging objections because the judges who have carried out the arduous task of judging cannot be asked to wait longer.
16. All matters not covered by these Rules shall be left to the discretion of the Chrysanthemum Show Committee of the Floriculture Society Noida, whose decision shall be final and binding.
17. Cups will be awarded for 1st, 2nd & 3rd prize winners.
